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Developing a Family Mission Statement

A family effort must involve all members to produce something meaningful to everyone. Here are some suggestions for developing a family mission statement.

- First, consider goals.
 What does the family stand for?
 What values does the family live by?
 What is the desired outcome for the family?
 What Scripture summarizes the family intent?
- 2. Second, conceptualize the statement.

The family can start to outline a statement that might include phrases similar to these: The family stands for ... living by the values of ... the family needs are address by ... and tries to resolve problems by ... The family will be striving to make time for ... and place less emphasis on ... The goal for the future is to ... and ultimately to live together in heaven. The Scripture verses that guide our efforts are . . .

Examples:

Our family will share the love, grace and mercy of Jesus Christ with each other, extended family, neighbors, and the community, as we go through life.

Our family lives to be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ, sharing His mercy and offering His salvation to all who will give us the opportunity.

This family exists to live the great commandments and fulfill the Great Commission, beginning in our home and extending to every arena of life.

Our family will work, play, pray, and study God's Word together with the goal of becoming Christ-like and sharing the love of Jesus will all those around us.

The mission of our family is to share the way of salvation through Jesus Christ with a lost and hurting world. We will do this by modeling a Christ-like life first in our home, living the attitude and actions of Jesus before each other.
