This is the Greek for 1 John 1. Our goal is to read and understand this in Greek in one year or less. Along the way, we will learn basic Greek grammar, including the parts of speech and basic sentence structure.

In the first 8 weeks of our journey, we will look at the most important part of speech in just about any language – the verb. The verbs are highlighted in green. We will start with an in introduction/review of what a verb is and then begin to look at the Greek verb.
