Session 5: Greek Person and Number

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"Person" is the relationship of the speaker or writer to who is being spoken or written about.

- About oneself
- About the person or people being spoken to
- About another person or group of people

In English we show "person" with pronouns or nouns.

- First person Pronouns I
- Second person Pronouns You
- Third person Pronouns and nouns He, she, it, they or nouns

Greek also can indicate person with the use of pronouns, but Greek can also indicate person in the verb itself without an additional word.

"Number" is self explanatory. It refers to how many people, place, or things are the subject of a noun.

Greek verbs

As we have learned, Greek verbs are formed by

Stem + Vowel + Ending

We have already learned that endings on verbs help indicate:

- Tense primary (present, future, perfect); secondary (imperfect, aorist, pluperfect)
- Voice active or middle/passive

Endings also indicate person and number. Remember contraction of connecting vowel-endings.

Active voice

1st person, singular Lu - w I loosen. 2nd person, singular Lu - eiv You loosen. 3rd person, singular Lu - eiHe/she/it loosens. 1st person, plural Lu - o - men We loosen.

2nd person, plural Lu - e - te You (plural) loosen.

3rd person, plural Lu – ousi They loosen.

Middle/passive voice

1st person, singular Lu - o - mai I am loosened. OR I loosen myself.

2nd person, singular Lu - h (sai) You are loosened. OR You loosen yourself.

3rd person, singular Lu - e – tai He/she/it is loosened. OR He/she/it loosens he/she/itself.

1st person, plural Lu-o-meqa We are loosened. OR We loosen ourselves. 2nd person, plural Lu-e-sqe You (pl) are loosened. OR You (pl) loosen yourselves.

3rd person, plural Lu - o – ntai They are loosened. OR They loosen themselves.

Before we move on, let's take a look at the secondary endings. Remember that these go with imperfect, aorist, and pluperfect. We will look only at the imperfect.

PRIMARY

<u>Active</u>

1st person, singular $\Lambda \upsilon - \omega$ I loosen. 2nd person, singular $\Lambda \upsilon - \epsilon \iota \varsigma$ You loosen.

3rd person, singular $\Lambda \upsilon - \varepsilon \iota$ He/she/it loosens.

1st person, plural $\Lambda v - o - \mu \epsilon v$ We loosen.

2nd person, plural $\Lambda \upsilon - \epsilon - \tau \epsilon$ You (plural) loosen. 3rd person, plural $\Lambda \upsilon - o\upsilon \sigma \iota$ They loosen.8

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Middle/passive

1st person, singular Lu - o - mai I am loosened. OR I loosen myself.

2nd person, singular Lu - h (sai) You are loosened. OR You loosen yourself.

3rd person, singular Lu - e - tai He/she/it is loosened. OR He/she/it loosens he/she/itself.

 $\begin{array}{ll} \hbox{1st person, plural} & Lu-o-meqa & \hbox{We are loosened. OR We loosen ourselves.} \\ \hbox{2nd person, plural} & Lu-e-sqe & \hbox{You (pl) are loosened. OR You (pl) loosen yourselves.} \\ \end{array}$

3rd person, plural Lu - o – ntai They are loosened. OR They loosen themselves.

SECONDARY

Active

1st person, singular e0/lu-o-n I was loosening. 2nd person, singular e0/lu-e-v You were loosening.

3rd person, singular e0/lu - e He/she/it was loosening. 1st person, plural e0lu/-o-men We were loosening. 2nd person, plural e0lu/-e-te You (plural) were loosening.

3rd person, plural e0/lu - o-n They were loosening.

Middle/passive

1st person, singular e0lu - o - mhn I am loosened. OR I loosen myself.

2nd person, singular e0lu – ou (so)You are loosened. OR You loosen yourself.

3rd person, singular e0lu/-e- to He/she/it is loosened. OR He/she/it loosens he/she/itself.

1st person, plural e0lu/-o-meqa We are loosened. OR We loosen ourselves. 2nd person, plural e0lu/-e-sqe You (pl) are loosened. OR You (pl) loosen

yourselves.

3rd person, plural e0lu/ - o— nto They are loosened. OR They loosen themselves.

English to Greek

Using the Greek stem, $\gamma \rho \alpha \phi$ add the proper ending to indicate the following person and number.

- 1. We are writing.
- 2. He is writing.

- 3. She is writing.
- 4. You (singular) are writing.
- 5. They are writing.
- 6. You (plural) are writing.
- 7. I am writing.

Using the stem, λv add the proper ending to indicate the following person and number.

- 1. I am loosening myself.
- 2. We are being loosened.
- 3. They are loosening themselves.
- 4. It is being loosened.
- 5. She is loosening herself.
- 6. You (singular) are being loosened.
- 7. You (plural) are being loosened.

Greek to English

- Stem + connecting vowel + ending
- Augment + stem + connecting vowel + ending
- Reduplication + stem + k + connecting vowel + ending
- Stem + S + connecting vowel + ending
- Augment + stem + S + connecting vowel + ending
- Augment + reduplication + stem + k + connecting vowel + ending
- Augment + stem change + connecting vowel + ending
