
Why this marriage conference? Presumptions

•Improving our marriages is not primarily up to us.





Jesus is the most important person in our lives and our marriages.




Why this marriage conference? Presumptions

•If we are unwilling to grow as Christians, we cannot improve our marriages in a way that honors God.




Christian marriage

The Gospel is God's great story according to the perfect authoritative Word of God. It includes





This describes a person's intentional, constant return to the message of salvation through Christ alone and how it informs biblical responses in all areas of life.




Gospel Centered

Everything is done in complete reliance on what God accomplished through Christ crucified and enabled through His Spirit.




Gospel Centered

Everything is done with the purpose of displaying this message of grace.




Gospel Centered

Everything is done in a way that treasures Christ above all.




More Presumptions

We believe that the Bible is God's inerrant Word and authoritative for our lives when rightly interpreted.




More Presumptions

We believe that salvation is by grace alone through faith alone.





We believe that God wants our marriages to thrive for His glory and His kingdom purposes.




Our intent is to encourage Christian couples to

•See each other first and foremost in terms of their relationship to Christ.




Our intent is to encourage Christian couples to

•See their marriages first and foremost in terms of God's purpose for marriage rather than their own.




Our intent is to encourage Christian couples to

•Understand how spouses can become equal, but not identical partners in one another's spiritual growth.




•Understand the blessing that comes in marriages in which Christlikeness and the Fruit of the Spirit abound.




•Encouraging is not demanding.




•Encouraging is not being silent or doing nothing.




•Encouraging means being willing to begin wherever your spouse is and move forward from there.
