Big Idea

Faith is living in the reality of God's promises and truth as we entrust our whole lives to God.

Outline

- I. Faith is living out our Christian hope in the reality of God. (v. 1)
- II. Salvation is through faith alone. (v. 2)
- III. God's word is to be trusted in order to understand our world.
